- `bono10000.do` is the Stata do file used to produce all tables and figures, except for Tables A1 and A2 in the online appendix. It references datasets on the Bono 10,000 experiment (`bono10000.dta`) and the earlier PRAF-II experiment (`prafii.dta`).
- Some code is commented-out in `bono10000.do` because it requires data that could not be publicly released at the time of publication. This includes data on administrative payments used in Tables 5 and 6, and in Figures 1 to 4. It also includes data from a follow-up survey used in Table C2 of the online appendix (for further details on this dataset, see Benedetti, Ibararán, and McEwan (2016)). The aforementioned data is the property of the government of Honduras. Please check with Patrick McEwan to see if the status has changed.
- `dhs.do` is the Stata do file used to produce Tables A1 and A2 in the online appendix. The code in `dhs.do` can be run if the user obtains the publicly-available Honduras DHS survey from 2011-12: <https://dhsprogram.com/what-we-do/survey/survey-display-369.cfm>. It merges publicly-available DHS data with additional variables contained in `dhs_covariates.dta`.
